## Fundraising Treks

This document sets forth the position of the Board of Directors of Himalayan HealthCare, Inc., a U.S. 501(c)3 corporation (“HHC US”), concerning charitable fundraising through “adventure treks” to be offered, organized and operated by Himalayan HealthCare, Nepal, a Nepali charitable corporation (“HHC Nepal”).

1. Adventure treks will be offered, organized and operated by HHC Nepal. HHC US will not be involved in conducting adventure treks. All promotional materials prepared by HHC US or HHC Nepal will make this clear.
2. Accordingly, all trek fees will be paid directly to HHC Nepal.
  - a. Payments may be made by credit card or wire transfer. HHC Nepal may explore establishing its own Paypal account for this purpose.
  - b. Explicit trek fee payment instructions will be included on the HHC website and all trek promotional materials.
  - c. Trek fees paid in error to HHC US will be refunded with instructions that payment should be made directly to HHC Nepal. Such payments will not give rise to a charitable deduction in the U.S. for the person paying the fee.
3. HHC US intends to conduct itself entirely consistent with its 501(c)3 status. HHC US will not enter into a profit-making activity in connection with the adventure treks to be conducted by HHC Nepal. Accordingly, no portion of the profits on the trek fees paid for adventure treks will be retained by or paid to HHC US.
4. In cooperation with HHC Nepal, HHC US intends to use the adventure treks offered by HHC Nepal to increase charitable giving to HHC US by raising awareness of the Nepali targets of HHC US’s charitable activities. Accordingly, HHC US may participate, at its own cost and expense, in promoting adventure treks and soliciting donations from potential trekkers. This will necessarily require cooperation and coordination with HHC Nepal. Such promotional activities may involve members of the Board of Directors of HHC US providing information and serving as a local point of contact to potential trekkers. All such activities will respect the distinction elaborated in paragraph 1 above. No adventure trekker will be required by HHC Nepal to make a donation in order to participate in a trek.
